THE SCOTS CONFESSION

The Book of Confessions is being studied in our Adult Education Class. This affirmation coincides with today's discussion. The Scots Confession is the first Reformed confession in the English language. Written by John Knox and five colleagues in 1560 AD and adopted by the Scottish Parliament, this statement has been called the charter of the Church of Scotland and of world Presbyterianism. This Confession teaches that Christ is the head of the church and lists the marks of the true church. It affirmed that all things necessary to believe for salvation are sufficiently expressed in Scripture, the Word of God. It emphasizes that grace alone is sufficient for salvation.
