The Psalms have long had a significant place in Reformed Protestant and, especially, Presbyterian worship. Martin Luther called the Psalms "a Little Bible, wherein everything contained in the entire Bible is beautifully and briefly comprehended." [Preface to the Revised Edition of the *German Psalter* (1531)] The Psalter is "a common treasury of good doctrine" [Basil of Caesarea] and therefore divine instruction for training the soul.

In this spirit, the choirs and congregation will be using the Psalms throughout the worship service.
