MPC BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP MEETS TOMORROW

The MPC Book Discussion Group will meet Monday evenings, in the conference room, from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. starting tomorrow, October 20. They will be discussing their first reading, *The Red Tent* by Anita Diamanta. A retelling of *Genesis 34* (also known as the rape of Dinah) from Dinah's perspective.

The second meeting will be on December 1 to discuss *Man's Search for Meaning* by Viktor E. Frankl. Psychiatrist Viktor Frankl's memoir has riveted generations of readers with its descriptions of life in Nazi death camps and its lessons for spiritual survival. Based on the author's own experience and the experiences of others he treated later in his practice, Frankl argues that we cannot avoid suffering but we can choose how to cope with it, find meaning in it, and move forward with renewed purpose.
