ADULT EDUCATION FOR APRIL

The Brief Statement of Faith was adopted by our denomination's General Assembly in 1991 as a creed for a "re-united" church. Portions are used quite often during worship at MPC. This creed, briefer than the Westminster Confession of Faith yet longer than either the Nicene or Apostles' Creed, provides content as to the core beliefs and essential tenets of the church's faith. It is the first Reformed confessional document to include a narrative of Jesus' life and ministry.
