UPCOMING ADULT SUNDAY CLASS

Adult Sunday School is held each Sunday beginning at 9:30 a.m. in the conference room, on the second floor. Join us for these current and upcoming classes:

- **"CHANGING CULTURE, CHANGING TIMES, AND A CHANGING CHURCH"**

Join Carter Lester, Interim Minister at MPC and former adjunct faculty in McCormick Theological Seminary's Doctor of Ministry program, for an adult Sunday School series on changes in our country, culture, and churches, and how they impact church life and ministry. The series will run each Sunday through January 25.

- **BECOMING MORE EMOTIONALLY HEALTHY**

This adult education class, spanning two Sundays, will explore anxiety and depression through both a clinical and a spiritual lens. It will help participants better understand these conditions by distinguishing normal emotional responses to stress and loss from anxiety and depressive disorders that may require additional help. The discussion will include how common these conditions are, the types of symptoms people often experience, and associated conditions.

We will consider what steps individuals can take to care for themselves in healthy, constructive ways. Emphasis will be placed on building emotional resilience through daily habits, practical suggestions for keeping things in perspective, and how regular daily devotions can help both spiritually and emotionally.

MPC BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP'S NEXT READING

The MPC Book Discussion group's next reading is *Fire Weather: A True Story from a Hotter World* by John Vaillant. While not a winner, it was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in General Nonfiction and is a comprehensive account of the 2016 Fort McMurray wildfire in Canada. The book explores the connection between the fire, climate change, and the petrochemical industry.
