How do I access Realm?

Stay connected to MPC wherever you go by downloading the Realm Connect app for iPhone and Android devices or you can access Realm through any web browser. Through the privacy setting, you are able to select what information you want to share with other MPC members through the online Directory (address, phone, email). You are also able to add your picture to your profile. **Please note, only MPC members will have access to the online Directory.**

How do I get started to join Realm?

Soon you will receive an email from Morrisville Presbyterian Church inviting you to use your email address as your login and create a password. To ensure it is not spam, note the email address will be from "notifications@onrealmmail.org". If you have any trouble or questions, stop by upstairs in room 200 after worship on September 14 and someone will be there to answer your questions. If you are unable to attend, contact the church office by calling 215-295-4191 or emailing office@mpcusa.org and your message will be forwarded for someone to assist you.
